



Relationships and Health Education.

From September 2020, all primary schools are required by the Government to teach Relationships and Health Education. Relationships Education is designed to help children have positive and safe relationships with family and friends, online and in the wider community.

Health Education will help children to make informed decisions about their health and wellbeing. We aim to enable children to know how to be healthy and seek support for any health issues that may arise for themselves or others.

At Eastwood Village Primary, we have been delivering Relationships and Health Education within our PSHE curriculum. We have reviewed our PSHE curriculum to make sure that our lessons meet the requirements that the Government has set out for the content of Relationships and Health Education.

We are currently updating our Relationships and Health Education policy to reflect the new statutory status for Relationships Education and we are inviting parents to consider this policy before it is finalised.
