- Children understand the idea of a positive climate for learning that encompasses a stepped approach to behaviour management and a culture that constantly celebrates and rewards success and achievement.
- Children are rewarded for good behaviour and consequences are followed through should inappropriate behaviour arise, in line with the schools behaviour policy.

Moral

- School Councillors are implemented and they are responsible for being a leading voice and representative for the class. They have bi-weekly meetings to discuss any issues with councillors from the rest of the school and the coordinator.

- Weekly Celebration Assemblies ensure children feel proud of their achievements and are recognised for their successes.
- Breakfast Club to give our children a healthy breakfast and discuss any events or issues they may have.
- After-school clubs – such as Boxing, Judo, Gymnastics, Dance etc.
- Our School Choir – which take part in One Voice events.
- Summer School – open to all children during the summer holidays.

- Children are taught social skills and have access to intervention programmes to support them in the development of social skills.
- All children are assessed continually to determine whether they would benefit from an intervention to support their social skills.

- Through high-quality PSHE provision, all children are taught about resilience, problem solving skills and are encouraged to persevere through their learning.
- Children are often asked to reflect on their learning and talk about what they enjoyed and what they would like to do next.

- A range of musical events throughout the year including Charanga showcase, Eastwood's Got Talent, Christmas Pantomime production.
- Celebration of key yearly events that link to children's cultures and wider cultures e.g. Chinese New Year, Diwali, Christmas, Easter.

- Children take part in whole school workshops and celebrations – Sky Arts project, Science Week, World Book Day, Red Nose Day, Diversity Week, Anti-Bullying Week.
- Job squad and Language Ambassador roles represent our diversity within school.
- Regular festivals such as Eastwood Funfest, Winter, Easter and Summer Fayres, World Dance Festivals etc.

- The school runs a number of trips to facilitate widening cultural experiences – Holocaust Memorial Choir Visit, World Dance Day run by Rotherham United Football Club.
- Charity DT events promote cultural diversity – Rotherham Hospice Fund Raising DT event Project.
