- ▶ They are an effective mentors for others to keep our school safe, respectful and happy.





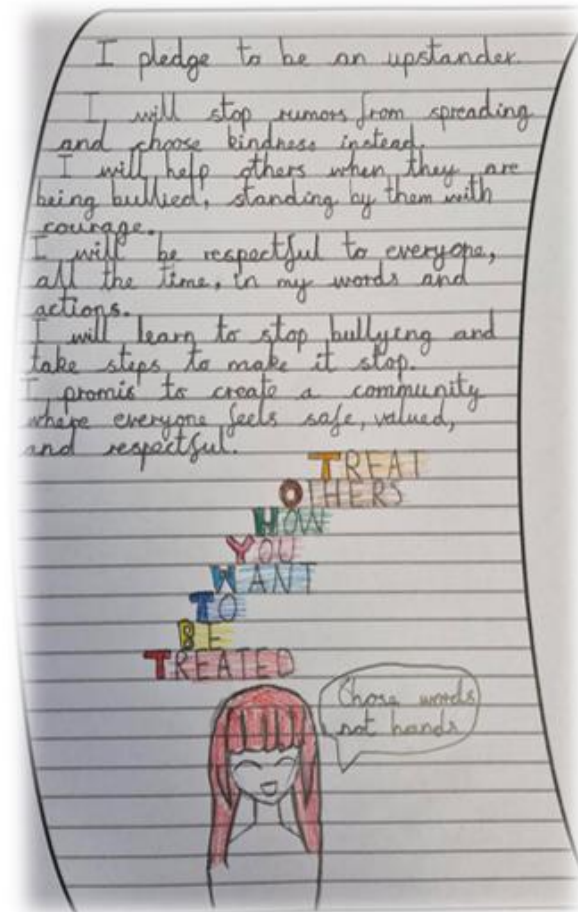
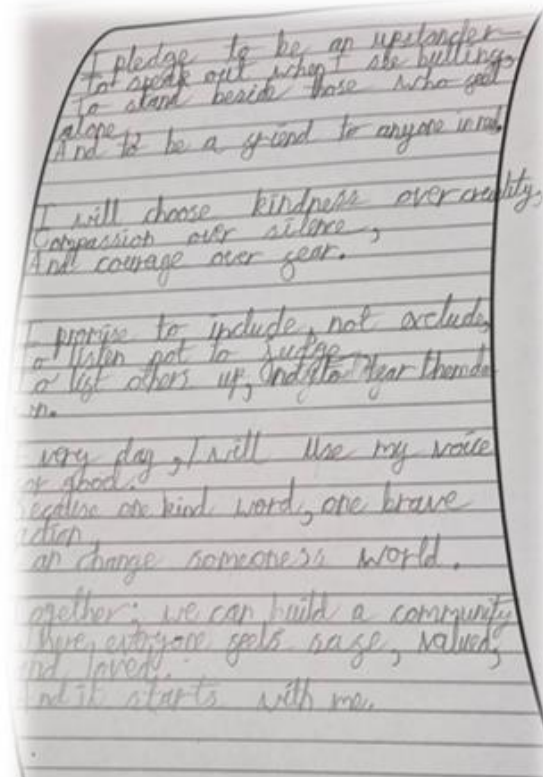
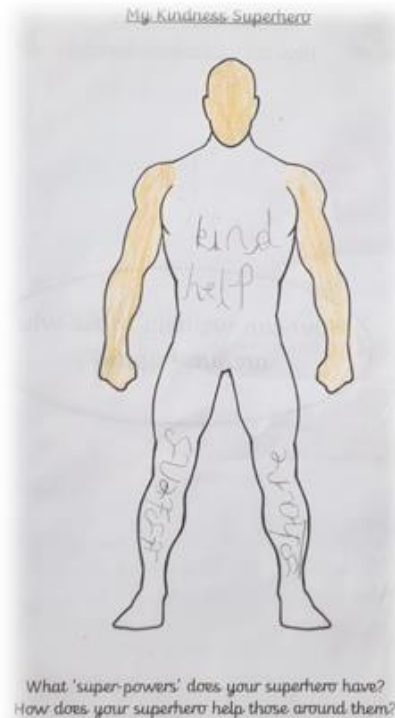
